Nature Printing



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Leaf Print Triptych



Accordion-fold the three panels to make this free standing.

Su<mark>pplies:</mark>

- White or light colored paper, 9" x 12"
- Fresh leaves of many types, with stem attached
- Tempera paints, at least 3 colors
- Dish soap
- Kitchen sponges
- Plates—china, foam or plastic
- Black construction paper, 9" x 12"
- Glue stick
- Newspapers
- Paper cutter or scissors, ruler & pencil

Directions:

- 1. Lay out newspapers to protect surfaces.
- 2. Tear more newspaper sheets into 4" x 4" squares. (These will be used as "blotters".)
- 3. Pour 3 different colors of tempera paints into 3 different plates. (Suggested groups: blueviolet-green, red-yellow-orange, green-

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yellow-blue).

- 4. Add a drop of dish soap to each color and mix with a spoon or craft stick. (This will help the paint to adhere to the leaf.)
- 5. Using a different sponge for each color, lightly dab the underside of a leaf with one, two or three colors.
- 6. Carefully flip it over and lay it on a piece of white or colored paper.
- 7. Cover with one of the 4" x 4" newspaper "blotters". Press down firmly with your hand to make the print.
- 8. Carefully lift off the blotter.
- Carefully lift off the leaf by the stem. Repeat with more leaf prints until you have filled your page. You can make some overlap if desired.
- 10. Once the paint is dried, cut the printed paper into 3 rectangles, 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" each. Try to create a nice composition on each one.
- 11. Cut the 9" x 12" black paper to 7" x 12".
- 12. Glue the three leaf print panels to the black paper

as shown on at the top with the glue stick.

You may wish to create 2 sheets of prints on 2 different color papers. Then use the best of both.

You can "accordionfold" the panels to make the triptych freestanding.
